Working to Increase Comfort & Safety for Participants and Staff

David is an avid sports fan who keeps us up to date on the latest hockey or baseball games. He loves music, listening to CDs and attending concerts. David is also a weather watcher. Weather disturbances and their possible effects cause him to feel anxious. A power outage and the uncertainty it brings for him and others here at Bonny Lea Farm adds to these feelings.

Our current manual-start generators provide only partial power in our homes. Over a year ago we began efforts to install automatic generators in our homes to provide seamless power supply. We are still raising funds to meet this \$150,000 goal.

In recent months local Lions Clubs have made donations towards this project of nearly \$3000 and we have received private donations of \$5000. We have a long way to go, but will continue to work towards our goal. We are grateful for the support we have received so far.
