I Pads and the Benefits of their Use for People with Disabilities

The I Pad is a device that many enjoy recreationally, but many people with disabilities benefit from what it has to offer as a functional tool. Our participants can enhance and develop their communication skills, learn how to adapt to situations, and develop social skills. The "touch" feature of this device has made it exceptionally accessible. This is so important for people with fine motor challenges. There is no mouse, keyboard or pen to manipulate. As a form of communication I pads with one touch can give a person without a voice the ability to communicate a need or to express a feeling.

Susan has now expanded her usage of the I pad to include reading books, doing crossword puzzles and recently Sudoku! A great way to expand her mind. Susan is educating herself which fosters independence, self motivation and nurtures creativity in being able to try different activities.

When funding permits, we wish to provide more participants with these devices that will open up many functional activities thereby increasing independence at work, at home and in the community.






