
Debbie grew up on a farm with pigs, cows, hens and horses and there are few places she would rather be. Having the opportunity to spend time around horses is something very special for her and is a goal she had identified in her annual Individual Program Plan. Each participant at Bonny Lea Farm sets out their goals in a plan each year.

For the last number of months Debbie has had a work placement at Hinchinbrook Farm, as part of Bonny Lea Farm's Broadening Options program. Each Monday morning Debbie works with program director, Patty McGill in and around the barn cleaning out the stalls, getting hay, cleaning equipment and grooming the horses.

When asked if she had anything she would like to say about her experience at the Farm, Debbie had two words, "Thank you." But, she then went on to say, "I am very happy to do this. It is something I look forward to all week."

Therapeutic riding is a form of physical therapy known to reduce spasms, atrophy, incontinence and high blood pressure. The activities are designed to increase balance, mobility, body awareness, circulation, strength, coordination, muscle tone and endurance. Other benefits from therapeutic riding include improved communication, behaviour, task management, sequential and cognitive thinking as well as, building confidence, developing self-esteem and increasing social interaction skills.

Hinchinbrook Farm Society is a registered charity, which provides therapeutic riding to children and adults with disabilities. This program is one of four in Nova Scotia registered with the Nova Scotia Equestrian Federation.
