The past two months have presented new ways of doing things for all of us. Here at Bonny Lea Farm it has meant the introduction of many protocols designed to maintain the health and safety of participants and staff and keep Bonny Lea Farm Covid-free.

Changes have included: no work at day program for participants, reassignment of staff to cover days at home, stringent cleaning and hygiene routines, procuring and wearing personal protective equipment, receiving and delivering daily temperature checks, conceiving and offering new and interesting activities to engage participants in staying active, all while maintaining the balance that ensures all participants are still having the opportunity to learn and grow.

Recently each staff member received a personalized heartfelt thank you note from Board Members. We are also pleased that the province has recognized our frontline workers as essential staff, meaning that they are eligible for the same pandemic bonus as heath care workers. Thank you to those family members who wrote letters to provincial representatives on our staff's behalf and Board Members who wrote notes for staff.
