Transformation in Disability Supports

Through the largest transformation in Nova Scotia's history, the province is introducing changes to how supports are provided to people with disabilities. Bonny Lea Farm is actively engaged in the process, with many management, staff and participants involved in sector-wide consultations and planning meetings.

Growing Independence at Home

In Bonny Lea Farm's nine, and soon to be eleven, supported living homes, participants live as independently as they are able.

This looks different for each participant and each home, with some needing more or less support from staff for daily activities, getting ready for work, medical appointments and social engagements.

For those who live at Bonny Lea Farm, we will continue to support them in achieving their goals and work to ensure that each person lives with choice and dignity.

A New Way of Working

For most participants, going to work in one of our social enterprises and participating in activities at day program has been a Monday to Friday routine for years.

The proceeds from the products we make go right back into paying participants. While the sense of productivity is invaluable, the proceeds of sales together with fundraised dollars, has never been enough to pay them a fair wage. Currently, only those who work at The Shop on Central are paid minimum wage.

Over the coming months, we will be exploring ways to ensure that other participants are paid for their work. This will mean that some of our crews will see changes in what they do.
